

Heather Moyse Two-Time Olympic Gold Medallist







KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Describing two-time Olympic Gold Medallist Heather Moyse in one phrase is a difficult task, as she is so much to so many: multi-sport national athlete, inspirational speaker, ambassador, bionic woman, philanthropist, role model, and above all, Champion.

Heather lives by her personal motto, "Believe in the possibilities," and inspires people all around the world with her life story and her life philosophies. From the small Prince Edward Island town of Summerside to the top of the Olympic podium, Heather Moyse, whom some have suggested is Canada's best ever all-round female athlete, has accomplished the unlikely not once, not twice, but multiple times by believing in those very possibilities.

Giving back to her community and inspiring others is also an important part of Heather's life. As she describes it, she may own the medals, but she won them for her country and wants to share them and her inspirational story with as many as she can. But beyond her many appearances and speaking engagements, Heather is involved in a number of fund-raising initiatives, has been a member-at-large for the Commonwealth Games Canada since 2002, an Athlete Ambassador for the charity Right to Play, has been named one of thirty-seven Athlete Role Models from around the world for the 2014 Youth Olympic Games, and is actively involved with Camp Triumph on PEI, a unique residential camp for children who have family members with chronic illness or disability. A proud Summerside native and Prince Edward Islander, Heather continually recognizes the extraordinary support that her hometown and home province gives her, and gives back as much as she can to the community that contributed so much to making her the person and athlete that she is today.

"Believe in the possibilities." To some, it's an inspirational quote, but for two-time Olympic Gold Medalist, Heather Moyse, it's a way of life. Heather's incredible record of excellence has caught the eye of many, and, as an exemplary role model in both sport and life, Heather is an inspiration to people of all ages, and stands as a symbol of what it is to be a true leader and champion.

PANEL DISCUSSION: CANADIAN WATER AND WASTEWATER OPERATOR CERTIFICATION BEST PRACTICES

The Canadian Water and Wastewater Operator Certification Committee (CWWOCC) was established by the Canadian members of the Association of Boards of Certification (ABC) to develop Canadian operator certification best practices. Since 2009, an agreement is required for each province and territory to issue the same type and level of drinking water and wastewater certificate that has been issued in other provinces and territories provided that the certificate is in good standing. A document has been developed and published titled "CANADIAN WATER AND WASTEWATER OPERATOR CERTIFICATION BEST PRACTICES", which is intended to be used by each jurisdiction to review their programs and where possible to align procedures and rules to achieve the intent of the best practices in the most practical manner available. Jurisdictional representatives from the provinces will provide detail on the history of development of these best practices and update delegates with specific jurisdictional information concerning individual provincial certification programs.

FACILITY TOURS

IMPORTANT: Safety boots are required for the Rustico facility tour. Delegates should have appropriate footwear for the other tours ("Spring in the Maritimes" footwear), as most of the tours are outdoors.

Rustico SBR Wastewater Treatment Facility

The plant consists of screening mechanical screw conveyor and headworks pump station. The flow is directed to the plant from a large liftstation located close to the former plant and flows by gravity into the headworks. The Pump station sends the wastewater to the SBR tanks, which consist of pre-react and main treatment tanks. The Sanitaire fine bubble diffusers are installed in the base of the SBR tank and a decanter is installed on the end of each tank. A sludge pump is installed in each tank for sludge wasting. The final step of the treatment process includes a post treatment equalization tank which allows discharge flow to be metered. In the basement of the WWTP building are two Wedeco UV disinfection systems and flow meter. The UV system is designed for fecal coliform and virus inactivation.

Stratford Wastewater Treatment Facility - Blue Frog System

The Blue Frog system was installed to eliminate odour, expand the lagoon capacity and work effectively to serve the town as it grows over the next five to 10 years. The system is a variety of floating units combined with floating curtains that form virtual tanks, or cells, that act together to create a system that is practically identical to a modern waste treatment plant. It is designed to work in cold winters with ice cover, requires no special training for staff and does not have a high demand for electricity.

Stratford Well Field Property

The town officially opened the well field in 2013 as part of the town's ongoing water and sewer servicing strategy. The project involved the installation of two new production wells in a location that would allow the town to purchase and regulate the surrounding property in order to provide a protected water supply to residents in Stratford

CARI Complex - Energy Conservation Measures and D.E. Filtration

CARI Complex, located on the grounds of UPEI, houses an Aquatics Facility and the MacLauchlan Arena. The tour will show some of the changes that have been made to reclaim energy, especially heat, within the facilities. Their Diatomaceous Earth pool water filtration system will also be part of this tour.

WORKSHOP TOPICS

Tuesday, April 21st 9:30 - 10:30 AM: Choose Workshop A, B, or C

Workshop A: *S.M.A.R.T. Flushing Technology.* The workshop will cover how the S.M.A.R.T. (System Management Assisted by Remote Telemetry) Flushing System advances water quality management, warns of potential breaches in safety and security in a line, identifies and addresses low disinfectant residual conditions, assists in the maintenance of a distribution line while enhancing a utility's compliance efforts through automated flushing and conserves natural and financial resources. Presenters: Jeff Jensen, Mueller Canada

Workshop B: Blue Frog System: A New Spin on Lagoon Based Wastewater Treatment. Many municipal wastewater operators are facing an increasingly challenging task of teasing more performance out of aging infrastructure like sewage lagoons. This presentation will look at how one community, Stratford, PE, has adopted an innovative new approach called the Blue Frog System in an effort to meet the wastewater treatment needs of their growing community and demonstrate how emerging technologies like the Blue Frog System can help to increase the level of treatment performance from existing infrastructure like sewage lagoons without adding all new infrastructure. Presenter: Josh Clark, Owner Terrapin Water

Workshop C: Sampling Strategies to Ensure Data Quality: How You Sample can Affect Your Results. Daily, analytical laboratory data is relied upon in making decisions regarding process control and regulatory compliance. It is commonly found that one of the most significant sources of variability in test results is the sample itself. This session will discuss sampling strategies to improve data reliability, to avoid contamination, use of correct preservatives and sample bottles as well as communication with the lab using the Chain of Custody form will be covered. Specific examples will be used to illustrate the points discussed. Presenter: James MacDonald, M.Sc., Technical Services Manager, AGAT Laboratories

10:45 - 11:45 AM: Choose Workshop D, E or F

Workshop D: *Metrology.* In line with this year's conference theme, 'Confidence in Facilities and Operations,' the presentation will cover the improvement of operational efficiency and environmental impact as it relates to water measurement – water meters. Eternal meter technologies, data collection and sample downloading and troubleshooting will be explored. The discussion of meter manufacturing will be discussed with regard to new regulations and how the industry has met these challenges. The presentation will incorporate the physical meters as well as a slide show. Presenter: Tom Cameron, President/CEO, Scotia Tech Fluid Services Ltd

Workshop E: Charlottetown Wellfield Development. This presentation will provide an overview of the City of Charlottetown's new groundwater water supply project currently underdevelopment. The presentation will provide an overview of exploration, wellhead development, permitting requirements, and present the proposed infrastructure needed to connect the water supply to the existing distribution system. Presenter: Richard MacEwen, P.Eng. Assistant Manager, Charlottetown Water and Sewer Utility

Workshop F: Simple, Cost Effective Wastewater Treatment for Small Rural Communities. This workshop will explain how the village of North Rustico, PE, took progressive and forward-looking steps to improve the handling of wastewater through the building of a state-of-the-art sewage treatment facility. It resulted in the village being awarded the Excellence

Workshop G: Water Conservation - "Stratford Water School: Saving Water One Drop at a Time." This workshop will help to develop awareness of the relationship between the watershed and Utility regarding water use. Based on the Waters Cool program offered in partnership by the Town of Stratford and the Stratford Area Watershed group, this is guaranteed to be a fun and interactive workshop for all MPWWA participants. The presenters feel it's important to include 'where water comes from' and its relationship out 'in nature', in order to give the participants a better respect and understanding of why it's so important to conserve and protect our water resources. Presenters: Billy Ramsay, Utility Technician, Town of Stratford and Kelley Arnold, DET, BES, Watershed Coordinator, Stratford Area Watershed Improvement Group (SAWIG)

Workshop H: Attacking Inflow and Infiltration - Lifespan Manhole Systems. This presentation will discuss the physical, environmental and financial impact of inflow and infiltration for sanitary sewer systems and new approaches to reduce its entry through the top of manhole structures. Presenter: Daniel Léger, Business Development Manager of Sustainable Solutions, Hamilton Kent

Workshop I: (Atelier Français) Entretien et Opération à la Pompe de Dosage. Workshop J: *Metering Pump Operation & Maintenance.* The municipal potable water production requires precise and reliable chemical metering to insure clean and safe drinking water. Components used in a chemical metering system must be sized to site specific conditions and maintained to provide safe and reliable chemical addition. During this hands-on demonstration we will perform an annual maintenance/inspection of a metering pump and ancillary accessories that are part of a sodium hypochlorite metering system. Presenter: Marc Szuszkiewicz, Eng., Regional Manager, ProMinent for Quebec and Eastern Canada

Workshop K: BioCord Reactors. Bishop Water Technologies developed and presents BioCord™ Reactor and Geotube® dewatering technology across Canada. These two technologies are changing how municipalities manage wastewater and biosolids. BioCord™/Biofilm Technology is changing the way of wastewater treatment in Plants and Lagoons allowing them to operate with much increased operational efficiency and reduced costs to meet budget challenges while at the same time meeting new regulations. This presentation will include research analysis as well as engineering aspects of installation for attendee's reference so that a more comprehensive understanding of this technology is discussed for retrofit, upgrades or new purpose built plants. Presenter: Don Bishop, President & CTO, Bishop Water Technologies Inc.

Workshop L: Hazards of Stray Electricity in the Water Distribution System. A hazard that few of us think about until it's too late, is one we may encounter regularly during our work. The fact that for years electrical services were allowed to use water mains as a ground or bond! When we excavate a water main or lateral for repair, there is the danger of electrical shock because of this. This presentation will help to make you aware of the dangers, equipment to check for danger and means of neutralizing it. Presenter: Staff from PEI Electrical Inspector's Office
