RWL is a local company in New Annan area that has a facility that washes and grades potatoes for producers that are going to processing facilities. They eliminate the chances of lower grades being received by producer. They also are certified by CFIA to wash potatoes that may have viruses on them that could prevent their use in processing. The wash water then goes through an onsite treatment process to deactivate the viruses.
